## Miss Job's Daughter Pageant Comes to Lakewood



Ohio's annual Miss Job's Daughter Pageant will be held at our Lakewood Masonic Temple on Saturday, April 23, 2016. This chaperoned competition brings together delegates from Job's Daughters Bethels throughout Ohio for a full day of activities.

Each delegate will have a private interview with the judges and will be judged on diction, personality, manners, sincerity, adaptability to the situation and general impression.

Delegates will be judged in their ritual prowess by reciting a portion of the initiation ceremony, given in Official Regalia.

A written test will be administered covering a general knowledge of Job's Daughters International Ritual, Ohio Manual of Rules and Regulations and the Constitution and Bylaws of the Supreme Guardian Council.

Each delegate will also make a stage appearance

during which she will be judged on personality and presentation.

Trophies will be presented to Bethels excelling in Sponsor and Patron attainment and to individual contestants in oral ritual competition, written knowledge, Miss Congeniality 2016-17, finalists, runners-up and Ohio Miss Job's Daughter 2016-17.

Guests are welcome to attend the Pageant's "An Evening with the Stars" beginning at 7:00p.

Job's Daughters is an international organization for young women who are related to a Master Mason and are between the ages of 10 and 20. While Job's Daughters does not stress any specific religious belief, it does encourage a belief in God and is based upon the Book of Job in the Bible, specifically Job 42:15 "And in all the land were no women found so fair as the Daughters of Job."

Job's Daughters is a sisterhood that bands together young girls for spiritual and moral character building, to teach them love of God, love of Home and Family, respect for their Parents and their Elders, love of Country and obedience to its laws, Respect for our Flag, and Respect for Others.

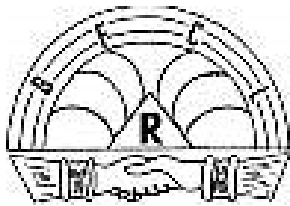

I would also like to challenge everyone to learn a ritual part this year and to perform it in lodge during a degree; or just put some time together later in the year to show off a little.

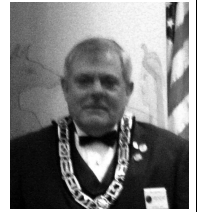

It's been several years since we've formally conferred all four degrees in a single year, but now we're well on our way to that goal! To that end, we'll be practicing the Royal Arch Degree at our March 16 stated convocation in anticipation of conferring the degree at our April 20 stated convocation. We expect to have four of our own candidates present.

It's never too late to start new candidates through the degrees, since we can take them to other chapters for courtesy work to get them "caught up." So let's do our best to recruit new members for our own Chapter in particular and Royal Arch and York Rite Masonry in general. As you can tell from the balance of the 16th District Inspection schedule below, there's still time to participate in the full cycle of degrees this year, so bring those petitions to our March 16 stated convocation! This will be a very special year for new and experienced members alike, as our Grand Chapter is celebrating its 200th anniversary.

Our May 18 stated convocation will feature a presentation from our District Education Officer in addition to our annual election of officers. While we would be pleased to have Companions step forward and volunteer to stand for election, please don't stay away for fear of being pressured. Come for an entertaining and educational evening. Come for the fellowship.

At the risk of being overly simplistic in a limited space, the Royal Arch Degree is the culmination of the degrees of Ancient Craft Masonry and is the degree in which we find that which was lost. 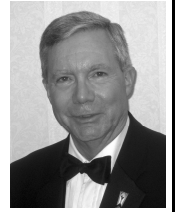

Companions:

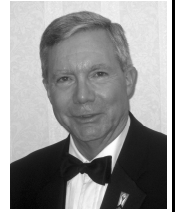

If you missed our February stated conclave, you missed a fascinating video and musical presentation of the history of our United States flag and the many flag versions that preceded it.

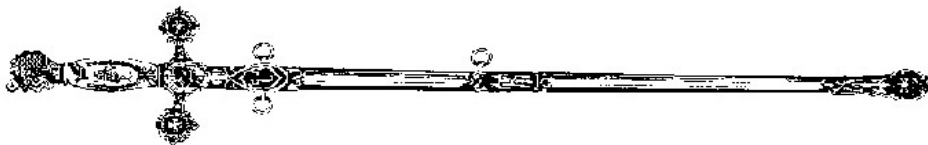
In April and May we will turn our attention to additional educational programming and the selection of officers for our next Templar year. Yes, it's getting to be that time already!

## Greeting

This word means *salutation*, and under the form of "Thrice Greeting," it is very common at the head of Masonic documents. In the beginning of the eighteenth century it was usual at the meeting of Freemasons to say, "God's good *greeting* be to this our happy meeting." Browne gives the formula as practised in 1800: "The recommendation I bring is from the Right Worthy and Worshipful Brothers and Fellows of the Holy Lodge of Saint John, who *greet* your Worship well." This formula is obsolete, but the word *greeting* is still in use among Freemasons. In Masonic documents it is sometimes found in the form of S\*\* S\*\* S\*\* [Ed. Note: the asterisks should actually be dots], which three letters are the initials of the Latin word *salutem* or *health*, three times repeated, and therefore equivalent to *Thrice Greeting*. In European Lodges, especially in England, a brief but most acceptable response to the usually few but always very cordial words of welcome to any visiting official is "Brethren, I greet you well."

## Kipling, Rudyard

Celebrated author and poet. Born in Bombay, India, December 30, 1865. His writings frequently give Masonic allusions peculiarly significant to the Craft. The story of *The Man Who Would be King* is a good specimen of the kind in question. His poems, *The Mother Lodge*, the *Palace*, and *L'Envoi to Life's Handicap* are splendidly typical. He was made an honorary member of Canongate Kilwinning Lodge at Edinburgh, a Masonic distinction of which he very properly has been not a little proud. The English *Masonic Illustrated* (London, July 1901, volume 1, number 10) says Brother Kipling was initiated in Freemasonry at the age of twenty and a half, by special dispensation obtained for the purpose, in the Hope and Perseverance Lodge, No. 782, at Lahore. In 1888 joined the Independence and Philanthropy Lodge, No. 391, meeting at Allahabad, Bengal. In the issue of the *London Times* quoted in *Freemason*, March 28, 1925, there is an interesting statement from Brother Kipling regarding his active service in his own Lodge in Lahore, Punjab, East Indies. He was Entered for membership by a Hindu, Passed by a Mohammedan, and Raised by an Englishman. The Tyler was an Indian Jew. This what he writes: "I was Secretary for some years of the Lodge of Hope and Perseverance, No. 782, E. C., Lahore, English Constitution, which included Brethren of at least four creeds. I was entered by a member from Brahmo Somaj, a Hindu, passed by a Mohammedan, and raised by an Englishman. Our Tyler was an Indian Jew. We met, of course, on the level, and the only difference anyone would notice was that at our banquets some of the Brethren, who were debarred by caste rules from eating food not ceremonially prepared, sat over empty plates."
